Driver intro: Cody Quattlebaum #33

Cody Quattlebaum, aka "QBOMB", has had a passion for adrenaline on wheels his entire life. What started with hot wheels and green machines at a young age escalated into offroading Jeeps, Toyotas, and the UTV he races today. Cody works full time in a ceilings manufacturing plant and is based in Macon, Georgia where he maintains his



UTV and tow truck in his shop behind his home, his trailer is housed at his father's who also races Ultra 4 in a YXZ. Cody is married, he and Lindsey have 5 pets. When they're not

at the races, Cody and Lindsey enjoy traveling and going to the movies. We are proud to have Cody as team Leader and driver for Bandit Offroad Racing out of New Hampshire. He raced local circuits prior to

starting Ultra 4 in 2021 where he finished in top 10 overall in the East regional championship. In 2022 Cody found more success, competing in National and East regional points in Ultra 4 4900 stock class where he fin-

ished 6th Nationally and 4th Regionally. His success continued in 2023, with the unveiling of the new single seat racecar, taking home two 3rd place Ultra 4 finishes, 2nd place East championship, 2nd place West championship, and a 1st place finish at the C.O.R.S. Aonia Pass Grand re-opening in Georgia. 2024 looks bright for #33 and we are excited to see how the season develops. 
Driver intro: Payton Dumford "Dirt Princess #7"



Payton has been racing since the age of 5, starting with offroad Go Karts and later progressing to racing Polaris RZR 170s. She has always had a passion for racing and working on her vehicles, even assisting her father in rebuilding her racing 170 motors from a young age. At 11, she transitioned to racing a Polaris RZR XP1000 in the Ultra 4 Series, becoming one of the youngest drivers and one of the few females in the series. In her rookie year,

she secured a 5th-place finish on the East Coast and 8th Nationally. The following year, she upgraded to a 2019 Polaris RZR Turbo S, competing in both Ultra 4 East and West series, where she

secured 3rd place in both series. Her ambition is to one day be the Queen of the Hammers. In 2024, with the support of valuable marketing partners, she had the opportunity to participate in her first King of the Hammers. Spending the initial week in Johnson Valley tuning her

shocks and ensuring were race-ready, Payton's next goal involved collaborating with HP Tuners to install a stage 2 Pandemyk performance tune for optimal rzr performance. After successfully passing safety and tech inspections, race day arrived with Payton starting in the 2nd row. She managed to get the hole shot and navigate the massive rollers at the beginning of the course. Once in the open desert, the rzr excelled, allowing her to speed over the whoops at 70+ mph and make several passes. Without encountering any issues, Payton crossed the finish line as the 3rd place physical finisher. Unfortunately, later in the day, it was determined that she missed VCP 27, resulting in a 5-minute penalty that ultimately dropped her from 2nd place to 4th place.











Ultra 4 Battle in Bluegrass: Cody Quattlebaum #33



Countless offseason hours went in to getting the turbo RS1 ready to race in 2024. Cody, along with his partners at Casslake Metal, put a lot of time and effort into repairs and upgrades so we could have a strong showing in 2024. Casslake Metal also came to the race in Kentucky to show their support and assist with last minute changes, such as installing the awesome wrap at the race course where his teammate Dirt Princess delivered it so he would have it in time.

Cody Quattlebaum tackled the challenging Ultra 4 USA race at Beech Bend Raceway, Kentucky, with deter-

mination. Despite facing stiff competition, Cody secured the 11th position in class during qualifying, clocking in at 1:38. Though he trailed the leader by 13 seconds, Cody showcased his skill and resolve on the track. The prelim race presented Cody with unforeseen challenges as he grappled with fuel injector issues. Despite his best efforts, he encountered setbacks that forced him to start at the rear in the main event. However, Cody's resilience and perseverance remained undeterred as he prepared to tackle the main.





Casslake Metal owners Josh and Ashley, along with Cody's Wife, Lindsey, and close racing friends, Aaron, Eric, Jeremy, & JT helped him prep the car so that he could race the main with the best chance to avoid further injector and engine misfire failures. In the main race, Cody demonstrated his unwavering spirit and driving prowess. However, adversity struck once again as

Cody encountered a flat tire on lap 3 of the race when he

took a bad bounce in the rock section. Cody fought valiantly for five laps, wrestling with the flat tire while maintaining a position in the top 10. Despite the challenges he faced throughout the race, Cody Quattlebaum crossed the finish line in 9th place in the main event. His impressive performance, despite encountering fuel issues and battling a flat tire, underscored his skill, resilience, and unwavering determination on the track.



Cody's next race will be at Iron Mountain in Dahlonega, GA on May 4th 2024.











Ultra 4 Battle in Bluegrass: Dirt Princess #7007



Payton was excited to be back behind the wheel of her RZR Turbo S for the Ultra 4 USA Race at Beach Bend Raceway. The Youth 4900 class has been growing and there was a stacked field of youth racers. The action started Friday with practice and then single car qualifying for the Youth 4900 class in the afternoon, she demonstrated her skills behind the wheel, securing an impres-

sive 2nd place. This would mean she would start on the outside of her long-time racing rival Aaden Gilbert for the prelims. However, things took an unexpected turn during the prelim when she came into a turn too fast, causing her RZR to flop on the side. Despite the setback, she refused to let adversity dampen her spirit. Even though she now had to ac-

cept a rear start for the main she was even more determined to push hard for





the front spot. As the race started, she unleashed her full potential, navigating terrain and turns with great speed. With each twist and turn, she gained ground on 1st and 2nd place, she was able to showcase her skills in the rock section making up time and positions. She was able to make it as high as 2nd place but unfortunately was not able to hold the position and crossed the finish line in

3rd place. She showed great skills, driving abil-

ity and determination to keep pushing from the back to the front. Her remarkable performance was a testament to her unwavering dedication, talent, and never give up spirit.
